Family Matters

I vividly remember that first Christmas Eve Rebecca and I shared in Richmond, Kentucky. We returned to our apartment after Christmas Eve worship, both tired from long weeks at the end of the year. Our families lived too far away for a quick trip home and were otherwise engaged, so we would be sharing this holiday without them.

We made plans to go out in Lexington for a nice Christmas Eve dinner and then to the ice skating rink. If we couldn't be with family, at least we could enjoy a romantic night together. We soon realized that most restaurants were already closed, everything was basically shut down, and everyone was enjoying the evening at home with their families.

So we heated up some leftover pizza and rented *The Hangover* from a nearby Redbox. Seriously. That was our Christmas Eve. Sad, I know. To top it off, we both found the movie profoundly disappointing. I tried to laugh, I promise. It just wasn't working for me. Looking back, Rebecca and I often chuckle about that sad state of our first Kentucky Christmas Eve: eating leftovers and watching a stupid movie by ourselves in the glow of a fireplace screensaver...

That experience made us think a lot about family, and about what it means to experience family when you aren't close to your own-regardless of whether that distance is locational or emotional. I'm convinced family is a spiritual reality that's created out of love, sharing life together, and responding to one another's needs. One foster child puts it this way: blood may be thicker than water, but love is thicker than blood.

This is why Christians have long called one another brother and sister. People who are not blood relatives share a bond so deep, so true, so intimate that only the language of family will do. And some Christians, including many of the first Christians, had to disconnect themselves from their blood relatives to follow in the way of Jesus. Indeed, when Jesus' own family comes looking for him, he calls his disciples his real mother and brother (Matthew 12:48-49).

Our vision at South Elkhorn is to be a family of faith united in



service. That is no easy task. Being family, real family, is hard because it doesn't just happen. But when we intentionally invest in and cultivate our relationships in the power of God's love, a lifechanging and wondrous thing called family emerges.

This spring we want to grow as church family by creating more opportunities for people to meet one another, connect, and enjoy the simple family practice of sharing a meal together. You are invited to participate in Dine with Nine this year, a series of meals over the summer months in host homes. It's easy: sign up for one or two or all four of the months-either as a host or someone who just wants to show up and bring a dish to share. Likely, you'll meet someone new. I expect you'll share in a conversation that connects you in unexpected ways. And, more importantly, you'll help be a part of a lifechanging process of making family out of one another in the miracle of Christian love.



Looking Forward

Cabinet Highlights from Janet Warren, Moderator

Your Cabinet Members are busily engaged in managing the activities under their leadership. I would like to mention a few of these activities and projects currently underway:

The Pastoral Relations Committee under Scott Brown's leadership proposed (and the Cabinet approved) several changes to their guidelines, including: each minister will have a team of 4-6 members, members serve for 3 -5 years and meet approximately 6-8 times per year.

An anonymous gift of \$5,000 was donated for use by the Worship Team to improve Audio/Visual equipment. (Thank you to the generous donor!) The Team intends to install a monitor TV on the rear wall of the Christian Ministry Center, purchase additional wireless microphones and remodel the sound room to the right of the stage (now complete).

Greeter and Deacon Training was completed. Peter Woollam has agreed to lead Fall Festival and Stephanie Reedy managing vendors and Susan Zeroogian managing food service. Beth Daugherty is leading Hospitality AND Facility Enhancement Team. Chip Dennison is leading New Member Ministry. Diana McKenzie is leading Dine with Nine. Sharon White organized the Disciple Webinar, "The Church's Mission with our Aging Population." Jane Estepp organized a Marriage Enrichment event.

The Cabinet continued "Visioning" discussion by crystalizing the values which we believe reflect the essence of South Elkhorn and which in turn support our decision making.

Financial Overview

The financials for the first two months of 2016 are shown in the chart. As you can see, our giving is behind where we expected it to be. Although the financial reports for the first quarter are not yet completed, I can report that the trend has continued. Pledged Giving is 20% less than we expected for the first three months of the year.

Fortunately, our expenses for the year have come in lower than planned (and lower than last year) primarily due to less snow removal and significant savings on our insurance. However, those savings have not been able to overcome the reduction in expected giving.

South Elkhorn's tradition of collecting pledges during the annual stewardship campaign allows us to budget for the following year based on expectations of giving. The congregation approved a balanced budget based on pledges for 2016. As responsible stewards of your gifts, the Finance Team will begin developing contingency plans for the Cabinet to consider should our giving not improve. If you pledged to give and have not yet contributed in 2016, please alert us to any changes in your circumstances so we can plan accordingly.

Giving statements for the first quarter will be mailed out in the next week. Please review your statement to check your progress against the amount pledged. South Elkhorn is, and always has been, a very generous church. Thank you for your gifts, and I will continue to inform you of our finances on a regular basis. Changes in the Neighborhood

The South Elkhorn Cabinet has been informed by Jake Riordan, Developer, of the potential purchase and development of neighboring property currently owned by Mr. and Mrs. C.V. Ethington. A drawing of the proposed development plan is posted on the bulletin board in the Christian Ministry Center located near Administrative Office.

The Developer has also met with Palomar Neighborhood Organization to inform them of the potential development. He must gain zoning approval and then finalize negotiations with Palomar and South Elkhorn before moving forward. As you can imagine, there will be an impact on the neighborhood regarding traffic flow and church access.



Richard (Dick) Murphy, attorney, is currently representing South Elkhorn and the developer. Dick intends to solely represent South Elkhorn should any conflict arise between South Elkhorn and the developer.
