## Mind Full or Mindful?

Think about it for a moment. Are you mind full or mindful? Are you preoccupied with worries, concerns, deadlines, or what ifs? Or are you living fully in the moment? I must admit, I am pretty mind full. I am living for tomorrow, and as I do, I am absent from the present moment. I am missing out on the here and now. It is a challenge for me to live a mindful life, but I have been working on this for a while. It is a Spiritual Practice that I will continue to nurture and nourish.

As part of this practice, every week for the past several months, I have met with a clergy group to participate in Lectio Divina. After a year in this weekly process, I was so inspired by my growth, that I decided to try this practice at South Elkhorn.

This past month, 20 church members attended our initial Lectio Divina Sunday School class. This class not only invited us to be mindful, but it invited us to open our hearts to hearing the scriptures in new ways. We listened, we shared, and we were mindful of God, each other, and the moment. Here are some of the testimonies from members of the class:

Lectio Class. I enjoyed my time to really breathe and "Be" in the class. —Tara Cox

I found it to be quite spiritual and helpful in terms of finding inner truths about myself and also being inspired to act on certain revelations from the text that we studied. I hope that we continue to develop more spiritual studies and classes like this. —Dale Warren

Lectio was a wonderful opportunity to pause and listen to scripture in a reflective way. Taking a reflective and focused approach allowed me the chance to dive deeply in what God might be saying in that very moment. —Zach Fuqua

As you have read, lives were changed and transformed from this experience together. We will offer this class again in October. I hope you will consider joining this spiritual journey as we grow closer to God and to each other.

May we recognize mindfulness starts within. Each day we can practice slowing down, utilizing all of our senses, and taking time to catch our breath. May we cultivate a deep awareness of the present moment and feel more focused, energized, and grateful.



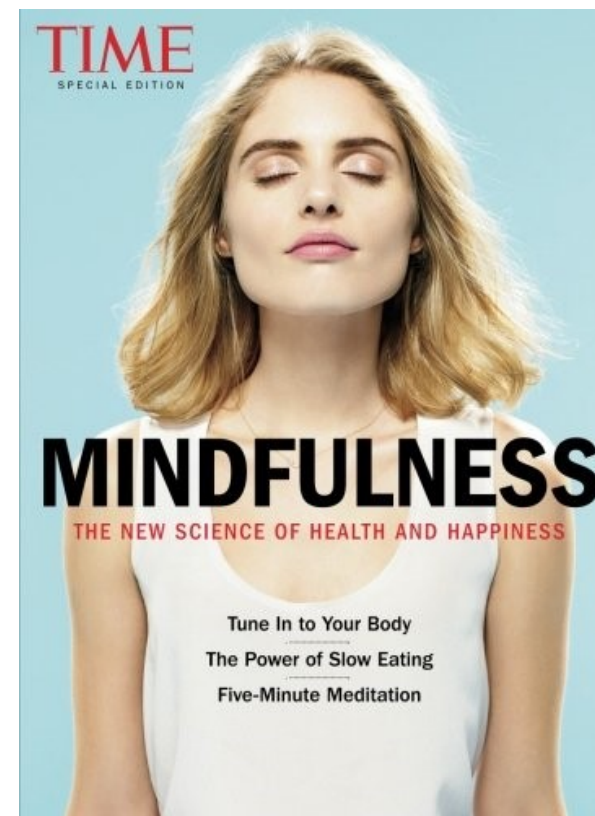

cubbies and closets.

The new year beckons us to take inventory of our lives; to reflect and evaluate. As a church, we are challenged to do likewise; to continually reassess our purpose and vision; to prayerfully discern who and what we are as church. ## Financial Overview: Debt Free!

The turning of the calendar has led to some exciting changes in the financial life of the church. We have made several changes - implemented new church management software and church accounting software, outsourced payroll, and contracted with a new bookkeeper. Not only do these improvements allow Finance and Staff to have better user-friendly tools, but they also provide cost savings to the church. You may have noticed that we have been unable to provide weekly giving figures in the Current, and this is because we are working through some kinks associated with the systems changes that should be finalized soon.

One of the enhancements with the systems change is a more user-friendly online giving system. In addition to accepting credit/debit cards, we now have the ability to handle contributions from checking/savings accounts. Information about our new online giving system was included with the 2016 contribution statements mailed out at the end of January. For our family, online giving is a great option. We don't have to worry about remembering to bring a check with us to church, and by setting up recurring contributions, we ensure that our gifts are regular and match what we

pledged. We even get to earn rewards points on our credit card! If you are interested in setting up online giving, simply follow these easy steps:

- 1) Visit <http://www.southelkhorncc.org/give/>
- 2) Click on the Give Online Now button,
- 3) Click on the Create Profile button, then
- 4) Follow the onscreen instructions to create an online profile and to schedule your recurring contributions.

The financials for the entire year are shown in the chart below. As you can see, we were challenged by the shortfall on our pledged giving which led to us to a significant operating deficit.

Finally, I am excited to report that our 3-year capital campaign concluded at the end of 2016 and we were able to meet our goal of raising enough funds to pay off our mortgage. **We made our last payment in January and are now debt free!!** We saved thousands in interest by paying the mortgage off 5 years early. We are planning a "mortgage burning celebration" for later in the year, so be on the lookout for further details.

South Elkhorn is, and always has been, a very generous church. Thank you for your gifts, and I will continue to inform you on our finances on a regular basis.
