

A Deeper Listen

Maybe you know the look. A curious child strains to pop open a box of their favorite snack while a voice warns "No! Do not open that...." Then the inevitable spill all over the floor. There's that look staring back: innocent, surprised confusion.

Hearing is not listening.

We can know that someone is speaking and still miss what they are saying. Maybe we aren't paying attention. Maybe we just don't understand. Listening is what happens when hearing meets attention and yields an understanding.



If you're like me then you might feel pretty confident that you listen, most of the time. Sure, you might, on rare occasions, nod and grunt as if you're paying attention. But that's only when the Ducks are playing and they rarely get TV time in Kentucky.

Even so, while we might listen to others most of the time, what if that is still not the same thing as deep listening? What if listening might still missing something?

Deep listening is what happens when we pay attention to someone else by first letting go of our inner clamoring and our usual assumptions. It is what happens when we intentionally create an "inner clearing". It is listening from within ourselves--with an open heart and receptive, patient spirit--not just leaning in closer with our ears. Too often our understanding is clouded by our own chaos, minimized by our assumptions, and projected through our own past experiences. We don't see how those things are actually coloring our understanding. We think we are listening to someone else,

Listening deeply enables us to hear what is there but is not being said, what is churning beneath the surface. When we listen deeply, we hear not just the content of person's speech or the sense of their sentence. We hear a person.

but there is so much in us that is getting in the way.

Hearing is passive, listening is active, deep listening is personal.

Jesus often said, "If anyone has ears to hear, let them hear!" This was more than a subtle reminder to pay attention. Jesus requires us to make an "inner clearing" so we can hear and receive his very being, his whole person. Perhaps this deeper listen is how transformation takes root.

I'm grateful for our upcoming Church Retreat in a few weekends (details inside), where people of all ages will take some time to practice "a deeper listen." This is a spiritual practice that requires intentionality, repetition, and dedication. And it helps to learn with and from others in community.

I'm also glad that we are doing the hard work of listening deeply as a church. The Visioning survey you have been invited to complete is only the first phase in a process of listening deeply to who we are as a church. It involves clearing what we think we know about ourselves and getting feedback from members and attendees, from our neighbors, and from the wider community.

May we each and all have ears to hear... and listen... and listen deeply.





Thank you for your generous gifts to South Elkhorn. Please look for your year-to-date giving statement in the mail, which is being sent soon.

We have some members who gift stocks/mutual funds to the church. For those that

do, I want to call your attention to a change - our bank, Traditional Bank, no longer offers this service, and we are setting up a new account elsewhere to handle this. For those that are not aware, gifting a security can provide some significant tax savings. When an appreciated stock or mutual fund is gifted, South Elkhorn receives the full market value of the securities, and the donor receives a tax deduction for that market value

amount without paying any capital gains. If you are interested in getting more information about how to handle this, please contact me.

The financials for the first 6 months of 2017 are shown in the chart. While our giving and expenses have come in better than budgeted, it is important to understand that we are still operating on a deficit - our giving does not fully cover all of our ministry expenses. However, we have noticed that giving is much more consistent than in years past, which can be attributed the growth in online giving at South Elkhorn.
