

"Moon! Moon!" He shouted from the backseat.

It's a bewildering and wondrous experience to see the moon suspended stubbornly in the dark morning sky as the sun crawls sleepily out from the horizon. In our three-year-old's mind, the moon doesn't belong to the morning. It is a symbol of night. And yet, in the late fall season that inches toward Advent, as the days grow shorter and the nights longer:



Each morning, he is so excited to look for and point out the mystical, wondrous absurdity: "Moon! Moon!"

As Advent draws toward us, I pray the same excitement and searching will permeate my soul.

Advent is about anticipating and noticing the mystical, wondrous absurdity of God's life stubbornly shining in the darkness, where it seems not to belong. Like a the cry of a baby piercing the silent night.

Even as we long for the dawning of God's fullness to permeate all the earth and our own soul--with its bright oranges and purples of justice, peace, and joy--even as faint flashes of light burst from the horizon; still the

darkness of hate, prejudice, sorrow, cynicism, and bitterness persist... even within us.

And yet, there is a light already fully visible in the darkness. It doesn't seem to belong. Still somehow, it is there. And like a three year old shouting "Moon! Moon!" from the God's life shines stubbornly in the darkness, where it seems not to belong.

#### **My Frown Turned Upside Down**

Do you remember the story of the ten lepers (Luke 17:11-19)? It is a story I had not thought about for a while, until one of our Children's Coordinators reminded me of that story as she was preparing the lesson for our 3rd-5th graders on a recent Sunday night.

"You know" she said, "when Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem he saw ten men with leprosy. Jesus healed them and out of all ten of them, only ONE came back to thank Jesus!" I thought about that for a moment - Jesus once healed ten lepers and only one came back to say thank you - to Jesus. That is incredible. Who doesn't say thank you to Jesus?



In her excitement of reciting that scripture, she joyfully expressed that she was going to teach the children the importance of saying thank you by teaching the practice of writing thank you notes. She talked about how sometimes we forget the impact of saying thank you and thought this was an important lesson for the children. After sharing all of this with me, she quickly went to prepare for the lesson with a skip to her step.

The next morning, I woke up grumpy. I was in a bad place. I had a long night and it was a cold, dreary, rainy day. "Just another manic Monday" was my morning song as I drove to church. When I arrived, I went into the main office and I noticed a little card in my mailbox. Curiosity got the best of me, and I opened it immediately. As I read the note, crocodile tears began to fall down my face, such big tears that my vision was blurred. I wiped the tears and continued to read a letter from one of our children from the church. She wrote me a long, affirming, thank you note. It touched me. It softened my heart. It changed my attitude. And all it took, was this thank you letter. The Children's Coordinator was correct. Sometimes we forget the importance of saying thank you.

As we approach the Thanksgiving Holiday, may we remember to be like the one leper or the child at our church and say THANK YOU. Let's make it a habit. Two simple words can have such a profound impact on others. So, share a little bit of your heart, make someone's soul smile, and always remember, God works in small ways, yes, even with thank you letters.

### **Financial Overview**

Thank you for your generosity in 2017! As you can see from the chart, giving continues to exceed budgeted levels and expenses are lower than expectations. This is allowing us to run a smaller operating budget deficit than planned.

The Finance Team met earlier this month to review the results of the Stewardship Campaign and recommend a 2018 budget to Cabinet. The success of the 2018 campaign has led the Finance Team to recommend a 3% increase in revenue -which would allow us to increase Ministry Area budgets.

Both of South Elkhorn's major fundraising events in the fall were very successful. While numbers are still being finalized, the Fall Festival and Fall Consignment Sale will meet or exceed expectations, allowing us to use those funds to make up our budget deficit.
